It's now the first month of 2021 and I have found an article that I wrote on 26 Dec 2011. I guess eBooks was my Christmas project then. I did not have a Kindle device then but used both a PC and Android tablet Apps. Anyway this document, based on the 2011 version, is now up to date.

Wikipedia says that an eBook is:- "An electronic book (variously, e-book, ebook, digital book) is a book-length publication in digital form, consisting of text, images, or both, and produced on, published through, and readable on computers or other electronic devices. Sometimes the equivalent of a conventional printed book, e-books can also be born digital.

The Oxford Dictionary of English defines the e-book as "an electronic version of a printed book," but e-books can and do exist without any printed equivalent. e-books are usually read on dedicated e-book readers. Personal computers and some mobile phones can also be used to read e-books. "

I come to eBooks with a need to read and write eBooks on my 3 Windoze 10 machines, a ChromeBook, Android tablets and phones and my new kindle.

Maybe in the future I will write eBooks that will help others and in particular those in the visually impaired community I will then need to make eBooks in both mobi and ePub formats.

Which eBook format will my Kindle read?

MOBI, AZW, AZW3, DOCX, PDF, TXT and HTML all these formats have their quirks.

eBook Reader Software

For Windoze 10 PC's

"Kindle for PC" is available from Amazon It works fine and will Sync between all my devices

The Sumatra app works well with PDF, Mobi, AZW, and ePub files. Sumatra also has a bit of a bonus that other eBook readers do not offer. One can copy text and paste to other software on your computer.

The Chrome extension "EPUB Reader" Reads epub files directly in the browser.

For ChromeBooks and Android Phones and Tablets.

The Chrome extension "EPUB Reader" Reads ePub files directly in the browser.

The Android App "Ai Reader" lets you open and load one book at the time and provides easy access to customization tools. Readers have the option of changing the font style, size or color, as well as margins and spacing. Screen rotation is also supported.

The Actions tab includes a Dictionary option, Autoscroll and Text-to-Speech.

AIReader supports a large number of reading formats including text, epub, html, doc, mobi and prc.

Also on Android is the Dolphin "Easy Reader" for ePubs. This App is primarily for the visually impaired community and has Text-to-Speech.

eBook Authoring Software

What is required here is a process, the end product of which will be either, a mobi file emailed to my Kindle or a mobi / ePub file saved to a disk on the local machine. There are many software systems that convert one format to another but few that start with a blank page.

The most versatile tool is Calibre which seems to be able to Read, Display and Write to all eBook formats but it can't originate a suitable initial file. Calibre is only available on Windows.

File types such as HTML, PDF and DOCX are the only formats that I can write to. Therefore Calibre is going to be used somewhere in the process.

Of course Amazon has software such as Kindle Create and Kindle Previewer but both make heavy weather of the task compared to Calibre and still require a docx file to start. Both are needed if you need to send a AZW file to Amazon.

MS Word / Google Docs are the systems with the least hassle, whereas HTML has the most potential for a document with both words and pictures.

The tool required for HTML is a simple text editor like Notepad, TextPad, Caret or Notepad ++. For PDF one can write in MS Word and SaveAs PDF.

Workflow

First decide what you want :-

Horses for Courses

- Quick and simple text :- docx to Calibre to Mobi to Kindle
- Large text and pictures :- docx to PDF to Kindle
- Mixed text, and pictures as a presentation :- HTML & JPGs to zip to Calibre to Mobi to Kindle

Then write the text using either a simple text editor or MS Word. See appendix for HTML code. Check the grammar, spelling and layout now as none of the next steps will do this.

Lastly use Calibre to convert your .docx file or the Zipped html & jpgs to mobi.

The Calibre user interface is simple, the workflow follows the screen layout.



1. Add Book
2. Edit Metadata
3. Convert
4. View
5. Save to disk
6. Email to Kindle

One tip that I use is to make a shortcut on the desktop to the Calibre Library folder "C:\Users\...\Calibre Library" Then there is no need to use the Save to disk feature as you can open via the shortcut, copy the file and paste it to your own books folder.

If you wish to view the eBook on Calibre OK but to save space I delete the Book using the Calibre Remove Books feature. I just use Calibre as a conversion tool. Be careful here as deleting a book will remove the book's folder.

Appendix

Basic HTML

Here is the basic layout of a HTML file. Use only a simple text editor like notepad to write this and save with a .html extension. The formatting of a HTML file is made using Tags most but not all tags start with <text> and finish with </text>

The structure is fairly easy to understand, I hope.

Start with `<html>` finish with `</html>`

Set the head with general information

Set the body, it's in here that you write text that will be seen

Turn on then off text alignment, eg. center

Simple formatting is achieved with the paragraph tag `<p>` but each `<p>` must be closed with a `</p>`

Shut down the body and html tags at the end

Copy all the text below then paste it into a text editor. Save it as ebook.html and you have started on your way.
